World AIDS Day Programming, Nasarawa, Nigeria

We provided HIV testing, counseling, and distribution of contraceptives. Out of 166 people tested, five people (4 new, 1 previously known) were positive, **yielding a positivity rate of 3%.** This is major. Four of them were successfully linked to care.







Feed the Elderly Christmas Initiative, Nasarawa, Nigeria

We held a "Feed the Elderly" social, medical and dental drive. This initiative provided food items, clothing, basic preventive medical checks, and dental services (cleanings, cavity fillings) to 119 individuals.

The ANPA Missions Trip was conducted virtually this year due to the ongoing COVID pandemic, and provided medical and surgical care to underserved populations in collaboration with Nigerian-based physicians. MKF donated 100 COVID tests to the mission as a contribution towards patient safety.
